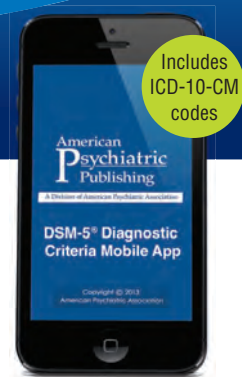

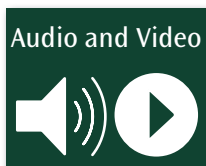
Cross-Disorder Genome-Wide Analyses Suggest a Complex Genetic Relationship Between Tourette's Syndrome and OCD

Revisit the Journal's rich history!

25 years ago this month: Sabelli and Sabelli on Process Theory

"Process theory is a comprehensive theory of physical and psychological processes that can serve to integrate biological, social, and psychodynamic psychiatry.... It provides three novel and clinically applicable concepts: 1) biological priority and psychological supremacy (as contrasted to theories of biological or psychological primacy), 2) union of opposites (as contrasted to psychoanalytic and dialectic conflicts and to systems homeostasis), and 3) creative bifurcations (as contrasted to determinism and developmental theories)."

50 years ago this month: Thomas Szasz on "The Moral Dilemma of Psychiatry"

Here, Szasz, who by 1964 had already written extensively, and critically, on psychiatry's role in society, argues that, "As science, psychiatry is the study of communicative behavior, and, as therapy, the practice of dialectic and rhetoric (and of social control). The principal roles of the contemporary psychiatrist are: moralist, rhetorician, and scientist (and agent of social control); and rarely, physician.... The basic moral dilemma of psychiatry is generated by the conflict between the self and the other." Although some of Szasz's essential premises have been undermined by advances in brain science, his rich and wide-ranging essay remains thought-provoking today.

This issue of the *Residents' Journal* focuses on the topic of women's mental health and wellness. Teofilo Matos Santana, M.D., presents data on psychiatric comorbidities in breast and gynecologic cancers. Jessica L.
