Developmental Change in Amygdala Reactivity During Adolescence: Effects of Family History of Depression and Stressful Life Events

In a longitudinal fMRI study in more than 150 adolescents without a depression diagnosis, family history of depression and high levels of life stress were each associated with increased amygdala reactivity, as is seen in individuals with depression.

Effects of Cognitive Bias Modification Training on Neural Alcohol Cue Reactivity in Alcohol Dependence

In a comparison of cognitive bias modification training and sham training in abstinent alcohol-dependent patients, bias modification training produced greater reductions in amygdala response and self-reported craving to alcohol cues.
