



About the Position

The Physician Chief of the Behavioral Health Service Line in the joint clinical enterprise known as M Health Fairview will serve as the academic physician partner in a dyad with a Fairview executive partner. These two individuals will share equal levels of accountability and decision-making authority for all aspects of service line performance across the organization. The dyad will work closely with the Department Chair, community physicians, and other key stakeholders across the system and will focus on quality, safety, patient experience, employee engagement, financial performance, growth, regulatory compliance, strategic planning and capital planning. The Physician Chief, as an academic faculty member, will also represent and advocate for enhanced integration of educational and clinical research programming across the service line. This role embodies the best of bringing academic expertise and vision into real-world clinical care.

The Ideal Candidate

The successful candidate will join a strong and growing academic psychiatry practice, with expert multi-disciplinary teams in integrated care, child and adolescent psychiatry, substance use disorders, psychosis, mood, personality disorders. Academic responsibilities include full participation in departmental and interdisciplinary activities including teaching of medical students, residents, and other interprofessional learners. Faculty will have opportunities to participate in scholarly activities including research and publication. Demonstration of clinical excellence and gaining a national reputation for clinical expertise and/or innovations in education/clinical programming is required for professional advancement. The candidate will have a strong commitment to scholarly achievement to support advancement within the institution. Robust mentoring is available for scholarly work, in a variety of disorders and methodologies.

The candidate must be eligible to be licensed in Minnesota and be board-certified or board-eligible. She/he must have significant experience in clinical program-building and medical center leadership roles, preferably within a large integrated health system and/or academic setting.
