- Nationally, regionally or internationally recognised with good professional standings and possess an established record in academic activities, where appropriate for the position.
- Experience in leading a team and planning for clinical, educational or research initiatives/development, with a track record of leadership and/or high level of participation at national committees, regional/international expert or professional societies.
- Advocate NUHS values of teamwork, respect, integrity, compassion, excellence and patient-centeredness with values of
 accountability and service before self with strong commitment to caring for and development of staff in the department.
- At least 2 years of clinical experience at specialist level.


