Social determinants of health accounted for the majority of the Black–White disparities in depression, cognition, and self-rated health and for the majority of the Hispanic/Latinx–White disparities in cognition and self-rated health. Other factors accounted for the Hispanic/Latinx–White disparity in depression.
