Figure S1. Among those with PTSD, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S2. Among those with dysthymia, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S3. Among those with a depressive episode, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S4. Among those with manic episodes, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S5. Among those with panic disorder, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S6. Among those with GAD, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S7. Among those with alcohol disorder, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience




Figure S8. Among those with social phobia, age of disorder onset distribution by age of first unexpected death experience


