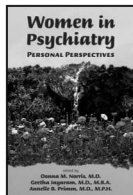

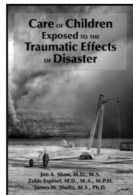
Women entering psychiatry or other health care professions face challenges their male counterparts do not. In *Women in Psychiatry: Personal Perspectives*, 21
