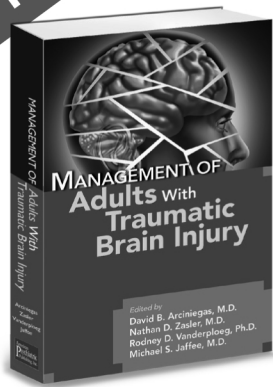

A multidisciplinary approach to the management of persons with TBI therefore is essential. Accordingly, this book presents and synthesizes the work of internationally recognized brain injury clinicians, scientists, and educators who were selected by a team of editors with backgrounds in psychiatry, neurology, psychology, and psychiatry. This broad range of perspectives enhances understanding and provides nuanced yet practical information on the neuropsychiatric management of persons with TBI.

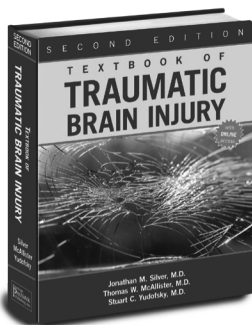
Evidence-informed, concise, and clinically rich, this book will be of enormous value to health care providers grappling with the neurological and mental health consequences of this widespread public health problem.

- Key Clinical Points that highlight concepts, assessment issues, and clinical management strategies in each chapter.
- A wealth of tables and figures to enhance the accessibility and clinical utility of the book, as well as appendices of additional readings and relevant websites for persons and families affected by TBI and the clinicians providing their care.

Impressive breadth and depth of coverage, logical structure, clinically rich detail, and concise presentation make *Management of Adults with Traumatic Brain Injury* a must-read for every physician, nurse, and mental health practitioner working to improve the lives of persons with TBI.
