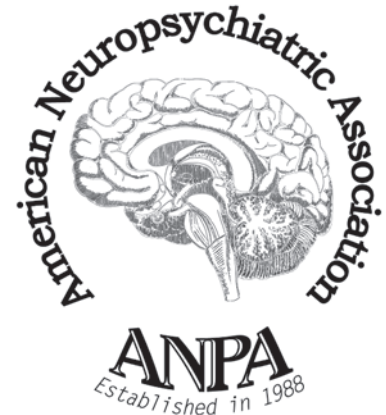


# American Neuropsychiatric Association
