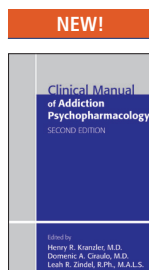


## Clinical Manual of Addiction Psychopharmacology, Second Edition

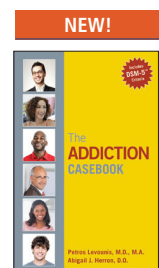


## The Addiction Casebook
